### **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH/ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:**

A major figure in modern medical history, Sir William Osler is well known as a scientific researcher, a great medical pedagogue, a humanist, and an advocate for a patient-centered approach to medicine.

Born in Bond Head, Ontario in 1849, Osler earned his medical degree at McGill University, and later taught at McGill's Faculty of Medicine from 1874 until 1884. Osler then joined the faculty at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia where he was appointed Chair of Clinical Medicine, before becoming Physician-in-Chief and one of the "Big Four" founders of Johns Hopkins Hospital and medical school in Baltimore – the first school of its kind to train medical students in a modern residency program. Osler finished his career as Regius Professor of Medicine at Oxford University, where he was also able to devote time to his passion for book collecting. His library of nearly eight thousand rare and historic works of the history of medicine and science is known as the Bibliotheca Osleriana, documented by a published catalogue of the same title.

Sir William Osler was knighted in 1911 in recognition of his contributions to medical science and teaching. His library of 7600 volumes on the history of medicine and science bequeathed to McGill University forms the nucleus of the present Osler Library of the History of Medicine. His life and contributions to medicine are described in detail in the Pulitzer-Prize winning biography *Life of Sir William Osler* (London: Oxford University Press, 1925) by Harvey Cushing.

### **SCOPE AND CONTENT:**

The Sir William Osler Collection, distinct from the Bibliotheca, is an extensive archival holding of Osler's correspondence (including eighteen hundred original letters), daybooks, accounts, engagement books, legal documents, book invoices, membership certificates, notebooks, lectures, addresses, newspaper clippings, photographs, books with manuscript additions, and miscellaneous loose items formerly inserted into individual books in his

library. The collection also contains various family papers, including the correspondence of Lady Grace Revere Osler.

**CUSTODIAL HISTORY:** Old accession number 326 (+ 153, 305 for addenda). New accession number 2016-001 added in August 2016 after a donation of letters from Lawton Osler in February 2016. A print copy of the evaluation of this donation, the deed of gift, and request for tax receipts are available in the accession file.

ACCESSION NO. 326 - OSLER PAPERS

The following is an inventory of the William Osler manuscripts, most of which were previously housed in the so-called "Osleriana Cupboard" in Room 307 of the Osler Library in the McIntyre Medical Sciences Building. The collection also includes papers of other members of the Osler family, as well as Osler manuscripts and so-called "Osleriana" (papers relating to Osler) which were added to those found in the cupboard over the course of many years, and especially during a rearrangement project in 1971 in an effort to form an artificial Osler Family collection. Consequently, and in ignorance of the importance of the principle of provenance in archival arrangement, the order of the papers in the Osleriana cupboard <sup>as</sup> were disturbed in the early months of 1971 and rearranged in alphabetical file order.<sup>1</sup> The provenance of several items was noted in an inventory of letters in the Osler collection prepared by Mrs. Betty Wainwright. The date and circumstances of accession of other items were noted directly on those items by Dr. Francis and others. Further note of provenance is to be found <sup>in notes</sup> on the manila envelopes used to store some items. Most are in the hand of W. W. Francis. These notes have been transcribed. It must be remembered, however, that it may now be impossible to match every item in the collection with the appropriate note of provenance.

The following check-list incorporates the headings used on the tabs of file folders prepared during the 1971 rearrangement and after. Up to the heading, "Osler, sir William - Unidentifiable Papers", the list corresponds to the 1971 arrangement; however, after that particular heading, the list assumes a more properly archival cast, since, by that time, the importance of provenance and the maintenance of the order of a collection according to its arrangement by the institution or individual who last held the collection were realized. Consequently, the list then becomes less logical. Items were listed one after another, simply on the basis that they were the next in line to be removed from the "Osleriana Cupboard." It is also acknowledged that several errors were later found in the 1971 arrangement, e.g. papers concerning Grace Revere Osler's death and will were not placed in the folder labelled "Osler, Grace Revere - Papers, Legal - Will" where one would expect to find them according to the 1971 arrangement. They were placed in the folder, "Osler, Grace Revere - Letters - Francis, W. W." instead. They were left there and their location duly noted in the list. Perhaps later in time, such anomalies may be corrected, but in the meantime, all available time must be devoted to items in the collection which as yet have no listing.

Folder 1: Letter from Revere Osler to his cousin, Nona Gwyn Stuart, 13<sup>th</sup> May 1916.

- Note in pencil underneath the date reads: “This should be 1917 as written after Campbell’s death April 9<sup>th</sup>, 1917 per Nona Stuart”
- The envelope that accompanies the letter is probably not the correct envelope, dated 12<sup>th</sup> April 1917.
- Revere writes about his cousin Campbell’s death at Vimy Ridge and his feelings towards the war (“how I detest this war and everything to do with it”), his feeling about his aging and worried parents, and having to return to the war himself (“on Saturday – alas!”)

Folder 2: Letter from William Osler to “Judge Osler” in Canada, W.O.’s brother Featherstone Osler (1838-1924) on embossed Regius Professor of Medicine, Oxford letterhead.

- Letter dated May 29<sup>th</sup>, 1907
- “Dean Fen”
- Osler writes about “poor Ned’s” death -- how it did not come as a surprise – and encourages Fen to travel to Oxford. Osler also provides Mrs. Divine’s (granddaughter of Benjamin Osler) Cape Town address
- This letter provides insight into Osler’s relationship with his older brother, Edward Lake Picton Osler (or “Ned”), who is usually characterized as the dark sheep of the family
- Envelope addressed to “Judge Osler, 125 College Street, Toronto, Ontario, Canada”

Folder 3: Two letters from Campbell to “Dear Aunt Grace”, 7<sup>th</sup> April 1917 and Easter Sunday, 1917

- Campbell is Charles Campbell Gwyn (1884-1917), the son of Osler’s sister Charlotte and Herbert Gwyn. Campbell Gwyn was a Captain with the 18<sup>th</sup> Battalion of the Canadian Expeditionary Force and acting Major at the time of his death. He was killed on the first day of the battle of Vimy Ridge, April 9<sup>th</sup>, 1917
- Valuable historical insight into WWI from a senior Canadian officer, written within days of the beginning of Vimy Ridge – a defining moment in the development of Canada as a nation
- These letters have significance beyond the Osler family connection

Folder 4: Letter signed from Britton to “Dearest Clare”, 13<sup>th</sup> January 1894, from 35 Avenue Street, Toronto.

- Britton is Featherstone Britton Osler (1874-1943) was Sir William’s brother’s son (his nephew), living in Toronto. The recipient, Clare, is unidentified.
- Britton discusses dances, and a large local fire that he witnessed (written at age 19)
- Letter is in poor condition
