Biographical Sketch : Notable members of the Worthington family of Sherbrooke, Quebec were Edward Dragge Worthington (1820-1895) and his son Arthur Norreys Worthington (1863-1912). Edward Dragge Worthington was a leading surgeon in the Eastern Townships, Quebec and the first surgeon in Canada to perform a major operation using ether as anesthetic. He served as a staff assistant surgeon in the British Army; and in the Quebec regiment of Volunteer Light Infantry in 1837-1838 in the 53rd Battalion. He was a member of the Canadian Medical Association and a governor of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Quebec. Arthur Norreys Worthington graduated from McGill in Medicine in 1886. He practiced surgery in Sherbrooke and eventually became the mayor of Sherbrooke (1901-1902) and was elected to the House of Commons in 1906. He was an officer in the volunteer movement and served with the field hospital during the Northwest Rebellion, 1885. In 1900-1902 he served with the Royal Canadian Artillery in South Africa.

Custodial History: Old accession number 479.

Scope and Content: A partial inventory of this collection reveals that it is largely composed of the scattered personal papers of the members of the Worthington Family, ca. 1833-1944, especially those of Edward Dragge Worthington and Arthur Norreys Worthington. The fonds also includes a few items pertaining to Edward Bruen Worthington and Asheton N. Worthington. It includes personal, business and professional correspondence; certificates, diplomas, tests, maps, sketchbooks, loose ledger sheets, testimonials, photographs and newspaper clippings. The greater part of the collection consists of the papers of Edward Dragge Worthington including correspondence related to his business affairs, medical career and family matters (1840-1883); medical certificates and diplomas, (1840-1847); two sketchbooks, (1840?); with caricatures of John Goodsir, Alexander Munro, Robert Knox and William Robertson; testimonials (1865, 1867); a resume of his education covering 1833-1843; newspaper clippings and photographs. The papers of Arthur Norreys Worthington are primarily correspondence describing his military activities in South Africa, 1900.

Language: The documents are in English.

INTRODUCTION

The Worthington family collection is comprised of the personal papers and mementos of a prominent nineteenth century Sherbrooke family. They center primarily around Edward Draggé Worthington and his son Arthur Norreys although his son Edward Bruen and the other children are mentioned briefly.

Edward Draggé Worthington (18~~33~~²⁰-1895) was the first surgeon in Canada to perform a capital operation using ether as an anaesthetic. In 1834 he was indentured for seven years to Dr. James Douglas of Quebec but after serving five years he accepted an appointment as a staff-assistant surgeon in the British army. Later, he spent two years in Edinburgh attending lectures and 'walking' the hospital, returning to Canada in 1848. An extensive practice in the Eastern Townships was built up and he gained the reputation of being a leading surgeon in that part of Canada. He was a member of the Canada^{an} Medical Association and one of the governors of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Quebec. Dr. Worthington was also a strong supporter of the volunteer movement and served in the Quebec regiment of Volunteer Light Infantry in 1837-38, in the 53rd Battalion since its formation and in active service in both the Fenian raids.¹

Colonel Arthur Norreys Worthington was born in Sherbrooke in 1862 and graduated in medicine at McGill College University in 1886. He became a surgeon of the Sherbrooke Protestant

Hospital and the president of the District of St. Francis Medical Association. In his career as a legislator, Norreys became mayor of Sherbrooke, 1901-02 and was elected to the House of Commons in 1906. In addition, he was an officer in the volunteer movement; surgeon major in 1887 and lieutenant colonel in 1901. During the Northwest Rebellion (1885) he served with the field hospital and was present at the action at Batoche and the operations against Big Bear's band. In 1900-2, he served with the Royal Canadian Artillery in South Africa and was present at the operations in Transvaal and the actions at Lydenburg, Belfast, Orange River Colony and Faber Put.²

Lieutenant Colonel Edward Bruen Worthington was born in Sherbrooke in 1860. In 1883 he took his degree of LL.B. at Bishops College University and was admitted as a notary public the following year. He was a senior captain in the 53rd battalion of infantry.³

This collection was donated to the Osler Library, McGill University by Colonel E. B. Worthington in 1944. At this time W. W. Francis (1929-1959) was the head librarian. He went through the collection identifying documents and pictures. His notes were found to be most helpful and in most cases have been incorporated into the following description of the material. By going through the correspondence between Francis and Worthington, it was discovered that originally there had been three sketchbooks and three scrapbooks in the collection.

Today only two sketchbooks remain. In dealing with the scrapbooks, W. W. Francis either detached or cut the leaves so that he could separate items dealing with the prominent members of the family. Thus, it is difficult to determine how much of the original material remains. It was possible, through the different sizes of scrapbook pages to identify at least two separate books.

Originally the collection had been given the accession number of 10033. Later this was changed to its present number of 479. In 1944, when the Osler Library first received the Worthington Family collection, it was found to consist of papers, correspondence, clippings, certificates and other items for the period 1840-1907 for three locations: Quebec, 1840; Edinburgh, 1841-43; and Sherbrooke, 1844-1907. The original holdings were later expanded slightly by E. B. Worthington and these few items brought the collection date up into the 1940's. In dealing with this collection I divided the material into four parts; 1st being the sketchbooks and related items; 2nd being the items added later; 3rd being other loose items such as photographs, diplomas and others; 4th being the items attached to the scrapbook pages. These parts were so identified and labelled as they appeared in the collection.

This collection provides one with an insight into the Worthington family life. The highlights of Edward Dragge's life as a medical student, as a father, as a doctor and as a soldier are revealed in these pages. Also through the eyes of Norreys we can envision the life of a soldier in South Africa and the Northwest territories. The newspaper clippings related to the Boer war and the election campaign of 1906 between Laurier and Borden are fascinating as well as being historically significant.

APPENDIX

A few of the items had a great many names listed, i.e., ledger sheets and rather than include them in the actual item, they have been appended at the end. They have been taken from handwritten lists so the spelling was deciphered as accurately as possible. Those names with a reasonable amount of doubt have been marked with (?) and the few totally unreadable names have, for the present time, been omitted.

The first of two Edinburgh student notebooks belonging to Edward Dragg Worthington. It consists mainly of pencil caricatures. This volume contains a drawing of Dr. Robertson of Montreal, one of Knox (labelled by E.D.W.) and two of himself. The location of the sketches has been indicated by W. W. Francis's tabs. There are also pages of notes on such things as definitions, courses taken, and a list of baggage.

The second of the pocket sketchbooks belonging to E. D. Worthington. It contains the pencil caricatures of John Goodsir, Knox and Alex Munro. A mounted black and white photo taken of five men full view. "Photographed and Published by W. Notman, Montreal" is printed on the front. On the verso are the notes of W. W. Francis: "From the late Col. E.B. Worthington of Sherbrooke 1945. The central figure is evidently the Prince of Wales, 1860 and the man on his right looks as if he might be E.D. Worthington. The first figure on the left is apparently Dr. Sir Henry Acland, who accompanied him (see D.NB. 2 suppl. 1, 554). Acland would be 45, Worthington 40 and the P.W. 18 in 1860."

Letter from David McLaren, East Putney, S.W. to E. B. Worthington on the letterhead of Rydal House, East Putney, S.W. McLaren writes after the death of E.D. Worthington. He acknowledges the receipt of a draft for £10 and a copy of the memorandum of the will. He quotes a possible text to be used on the tombstone.

Letter from J. J. Heagerty, Sherbrooke to E. B. Worthington, Sherbrooke, on the letterhead of the Department of Pensions and National Health. Letter from E. B. Worthington, Sherbrooke to Dr. Heagerty, Ottawa. It refers to the Dr. Gellie to Dr. Skey letter and E. D. Worthington's connection with a case of worms. It lists other military letters of E. D. Worthington as Acting Assistant Surgeon to the Imperial Forces in 1840-1. It is not signed and looks like a carbon copy.

A black and white, head and shoulders photo of a man in military uniform, most likely to be Arthur Norrey Worthington. E. D. Worthington's medical diploma received from the Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow. It is labelled "Facultas Medicorum and Chirurgorum Glascuensis" and still has the original seal attached in a round black metal casing.

- 3/5 Diplomas August 9, 1843
Two of E. D. Worthington's medical diplomas on a single piece of parchment. One side is from the Montreal Medical Board and is signed by I. B. LeBourdais and L. C. Lewell. The other side is from the Province of Canada and was presented by Sir Charles Theophilus Metcalfe. The seal is attached.

Letter from Alexander T. Galt to E. D. Worthington, Sherbrooke. He replies to Worthington's letter of June 10th and agrees to his proposal regarding the spring of water. He also says he will put in a new pipe which will become Worthington's property.

A black and white photo which shows civilians in the background and soldiers in the foreground. In the centre is a lady holding an unidentifiable flag. Written in ink at the bottom is "March(?) at Hirst to Hatley".

Letter from A. T. Galt, Montreal to E. D. Worthington. There is some confusion as to the piece of land which Worthington wishes to purchase. This is believed to be the correspondence regarding the land for the volunteers' drill shed and parade ground.

- 4/4 Letter Nov. 1, 18??
Letter from A. T. Galt to E. D. Worthington. Further correspondence between the two men concerning the land. There is a reference made to Dr. Robertson (?).

- 2/9 Letter Oct. 12, 1841
Letter from Thomas Smith, Quebec. There is no salutation. This is to certify that E. D. Worthington has been attached to the army in Canada as acting Assistant Surgeon for the past 18 months. The Staff Surgeon describes his work habits as being attentive and diligent.

Letter from A. T. Galt to Dr. Worthington. In this letter the land is referred to as a piece in "East Sherbrook". The point of question here appears to be the price of the knoll. Reference is made to a Mr. Hawker.

 Memorandum from W. H. Kerr, Montreal to E. D. Worthington, Sherbrooke on letterhead from Kerr & Carter, Advocates. It concerns the verdict of the Grand Jury with regards to the bills against him - they returned "Ignoramus". 1 page. 13 x 20½ cm.
- 4/7 Letter May 7, 1878
 Letter from E. D. Worthington, Sherbrooke to Dr. Jean-Philippe Rottot,¹ President of the College of Physicians and Surgeons. This is E.D.W.'s letter of resignation as one of the Governors of the College due to the President's conduct in the 'Medical License Case' which involved himself and Dr. Fenwick. He accuses the President of urging on the prosecution; of granting irregular licenses and the misappropriation of college funds. Others mentioned include Dr. Russell, Dr. Marmett, Dr. Belleau. 2 leaves; 3 pgs. written. 20½ x 33 cm. Handwritten.
- 4/8 Minutes of Meeting Dec. 14, 1866
 Minutes of a meeting of the Volunteer Officers held at the Town of Sherbrooke. Present at the meeting were Lieut. Col. King, Lieut. Col. Bowen, Major Ibbotson, Surgeon E.D. Worthington, Capt. Stevens, Capt. DeCages, Lieut. Bouase(?), Insign. Rioax. The purpose was to select a site for a drill shed and parade ground. King, Bowen and Worthington were appointed as a committee to examine the various sites in the town of Sherbrooke eligible for this purpose. 1 page. 21 x 34 cm.
- 4/9 Report Dec. 15, 1866
 Report of the Committee Meeting of Volunteer Officers who reported that they needed a drill shed and a permanent parade ground. They recommended the 4 acres of land belonging to the British American Land Co. which was treated on Queen Street, bounded on the east by A.T. Galt's property, on the south by Moore Str., and on the north by fifth block. Letter from W. R. Johnson to Lt. Col. Bowen, Sherbrooke. He reports that in Lt. Col. Ibbotson's window there is an effegy of himself made of a cocoanut dressed with whiskers with the words "Our Adjutant(?)" in Dr. Worthington's handwriting under it. Reference is made to Capt. Woodward(?).

Subscription list of names and amounts paid for presenting Robert P. Doyle, a member of the Wimbledon Team with a purse previous to his leaving for England. (see Appendix I).

Letter from E. D. Worthington, Sherbrooke to Lt. Col. Fletcher, Montreal. It describes the behaviour of the 53rd and 54th Battalions on their return from Montreal. E.D.W. reports that he heard Major Beaudry's name mentioned in a song in connection with a famed 'Sour Apple Tree'. He noticed no orange emblems. No shots were fired from the train but shots and stones were thrown at them. Reference to Lt. Col. Ibbotson, and Lord Alymer. On the top of the first sheet the words "Re Orange Riot" have been written in red.

- 4/14 Letter July 17, 1878
Letter from Francis D. Campbell(?) to E. D. Worthington on the letterhead of the New York Insurance Co. It is a reply to Worthington's letter in which he requests that Campbell look into the attack made on the train. Campbell declines as he feels this action might cause the men to claim damages. Col. Fletcher is mentioned.

 Letter from R. P. Howard², Montreal to E. D. Worthington. - 4/16 Meeting May 20, 1881(?)
 Meeting of the officers of the 53rd Battalion. Lt. Col. Ibbotson, Surgeon Major Worthington, Major Morehouse and H.R. Fraser were present. It concerns the reliefment of Lt. Col Ibbotson's command and the appointing of a committee of the above mentioned men for the recommendation of a replacement. 1 page in 2 pieces. 19 x 32 cm. 19 x 4½ cm. Handwritten.
- 4/17 Letter n.d.
 Letter from E. D. Worthington to ?. A.G.(?) recommended the dismissal of the voluntary officers for having held meetings contrary to the Queen's Regulations. Worthington states that the officers believed they were not offending any militia law. 1 page. 21½ x 36 cm. Handwritten.
- 4/18 Letter Nov. 21, 1881
 Letter from (signature undecipherable) to Hon. A.P. Caron. This is addressed to the Minister of Militia and adds to what was stated by Major Morehouse with reference to the 53rd Battalion. He states that the officers cannot be judged by Queen's Regulations since it is not Regular Service. 2 pages. 21 x 34 cm. Handwritten.
- 4/19 Orders Dec. 19, 1861
 Militia General Orders from A. de Salaberry, Quebec to E. D. Worthington. He is appointed Surgeon to the whole of the volunteer force at Sherbrooke. 1 page. 20 x 25½ cm.

Statement gives the amounts paid to Mr. Hendery Aug. 11, 1865

List entitled 'Recapitulation' gives the totals from the ledger sheets with a total and the notation that Francis' list is not included. A total of \$244. was collected.

Newspaper clipping entitled "A well merited tribute" from an unknown Quebec paper. It gives coverage to E. D. Worthington receiving the tea service.
